Going to the Eye Doctor at Mason Eye Clinic




I will get my eyes looked at when I go to the eye doctor. I will follow directions. I will tell someone if I need or want anything.

Next, I will wait until it is my turn to see the doctor. This is where I will wait.




While I wait, I can play with toys, color a picture, or do activities my family brought. I will be quiet and stay in my seat.
